PARENT PARTICIPATION

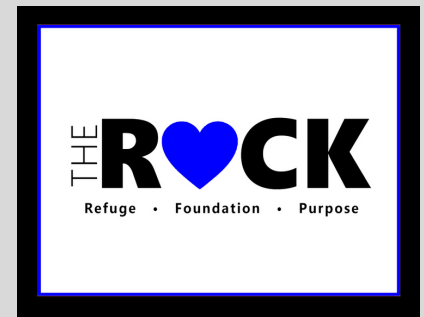
